Silver Buffalo Award Recipients

The Silver Buffalo Award was created in 1925 to honor those who have given distinguished service to youth. It is the highest commendation of the invaluable contribution that outstanding Americans make to youth. It is bestowed on those who serve on the national level. Some of the distinguished recipients of this award include Lord Robert Baden-Powell, the founder of the Scouting movement, and Gerald R. Ford, the 38th President of the United States.

This past month, the 2025 recipients of the Silver Buffalo Award were announced by the National Court of Honor Committee. Of these 13 individuals two have/are members of the Malibu Lodge. Bill Topkis and Gary Christiansen both served as youth officers in the Malibu Lodge. Topkis as a Lodge Vice Chief and Christiansen as a Lodge Chief. Christiansen continued service in our Order as a youth as Section Chief of Section W4A. As an adult he served as the Malibu Lodge Advisor, Section W4A Advisor, and the Western Region Chairman. Most recently Christiansen served as the 2023-2024 Malibu Lodge Advisor.

Both Christiansen and Topkis along with the other recipients will be formally presented with the Silver Buffalo Award at the Scouting America National Annual Meeting on May 15th, 2025 in Orlando Florida.


